Famous international architects and the military engineer Vauban contributed over the centuries to the development of the fortification to such an extent that it was

referred to as the Gibraltar of the North.

A few meters further on, the Philharmonie with its more than 800 vertical columns, and fitted out with world-class acoustics. The neighborhood is also home to one of the several seats of the European Union. The European Court of Justice, the European Investment Bank and the European Court of Auditors are also located here. www.lcto.lu

The Family of Man is made up of 503 photographs by 273 artists, from 68 countries, brought together by Edward Steichen for the New York Museum of Modern Art (MoMA). Presented for the first time in 1955, the exhibition was meant as a manifesto for peace and the fundamental equality of mankind via the humanist photography of the post-war years. In 2003 the collection was inscribed in the UNESCO Memory of the World register.

From the open-air museum to the university campus and the modern shopping centre: here you can find both the past, marked by coal and steel, and the new technologies of the present. But you can also see everywhere

how nature is reclaiming the former mining area. The Minett has a very high biodiversity and is full of rare plants.

Visit both Blast Furnace A and the City of Sciences Research and Innovation and get an overview of the history of steel production as well as the reconversion of the industrial wasteland into a new urban district.

The steep vineyards and wild nature on the Strombierg make this hike a unique experience.

16:45: Wine Cellar Tour with Tasting at Caves St. Martin

If you are following Luxembourg's Wine Route, you must visit the prestigious Caves St Martin winery just outside Remich, known as the "Pearl of the Moselle". Take a guided tour, including wine tasting, during which you will walk to the heart of the underground tunnels – nearly a kilometre long – that have been carved into the solid limestone rock. After exploring the wine-tasting cellar and shop, you can relax on the terrace overlooking the Moselle. The Caves St Martin hosts many workshops and special events, and refreshments are available from the Pavilion Saint-Martin. Warm clothing is recommended because the temperature in the tunnels is a constant, damp 12°C.

It was built between 1050 and 1650. Following major repairs, the imposing ruins opened to the public as long ago as 1932 and today they are regarded as a historic monument. Just around the corner, you'll find the Renaissance castle, which dates from the 17th century. The fascinating interiors bring the magic of the past to life. The castle can only be visited on a guided tour, which ends with an opportunity to taste the chateau's famous Casséro liqueur.
